Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Will my puppy definitely become a Guide Dog?

No. We have a world-class training program and every year a high percentage of our puppies go on to become Guide Dogs. In a few cases, dogs aren't able to achieve the high standards we need. In these cases we endeavour to place all our dogs in companion and therapy roles where they will continue to make a life changing difference to a person with a disability or illness.

Q. Could my sponsored dog be selected for an alternate role to becoming a Guide Dog?

Yes. A number of our dogs may be selected for alternate roles such as an Assistance, Therapy or Companion Dog, based on their temperament and attributes. If this decision is made we will inform you as to the decision and progress of your sponsored dog.

Q. Will I still receive updates on my dog once it is in training or working?

Once the sponsorship period you have selected is completed, we are unable to provide further information on the progress of the dog you have named.

Q. Does my money go directly to the pup I have named?

Your donations will be spent wherever the need is greatest and could be used for a host of things such as food, training and vets bills. All donations will help provide independence and freedom for Tasmanians living with disability or illness.

Q. How should I choose a name?

Make sure that names you choose are no more than two syllables long and don't sound like dog training commands such as 'sit', 'wait' and 'stand'. Avoid anything that might be embarrassing for a handler to have to call in public.

Q. When can I meet the puppy?

We need to make sure that the pup is healthy and settled with their puppy raiser before they meet you. Some puppies take longer than others to get settled, so you might have to wait longer to meet the puppy.

You will meet your named puppy twice – the first visit will be during the puppy raising year and the second will be once they have settled into their training school.

Q. Can I choose a specific breed, sex or colour of dog?

We are unable to specify the breed, sex or colour of the puppy you will be naming, however we will endeavour to give you a choice if possible. One thing we can guarantee is that they will be adorable!
